

Simple lines, a modest form, and a layer of hand-brushed lacquer give this petite Qing-dynasty tray a provincial charm that recalls the warmth of home. A tray like this would have been used to serve tea or food to friends and family gathered on traditional kang daybeds, likely the cause of the circular ware on the base. The brown lacquer finish has weathered from use to reveal the light brown coloring of its pine wood construction.
